



GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT MARBLE

MARBLE

- A NATURAL MATERIAL

Marble is a rock composed of crystallized limestone.

The creation process takes millions of years, and is caused by special temperature-, pressure- and friction related conditions.

Overall, there are two types of marble finishes; honed marble and polished marble. The honed marble has been sanded in a way that gives it a matt look and a smooth surface, less shiny than the polished marble.

Since marble is a natural material, each marble table top is 100% unique with its own individual structure containing different characteristics such as watermarks, shadows, graining, etc.

These characteristics are all natural contents of the marble and are not considered errors in the product.



GUIDELINES & CARE INSTRUCTIONS

Expand your furniture's lifetime by following below guidelines and care instructions:

- All kinds of acid, like for example vinegar, lemon, soda and juice are damaging to the marble. Therefore, acid should never be used on marble.
- In general, all kinds of liquids should be wiped off promptly, since these can penetrate even surface treated marble table tops and cause discoloration and permanent marks. This does not only apply for coloured liquids. Even normal drinking water contains minerals, which can leave marks on the marble table top, if not wiped off immediately.
- Avoid placing damp decoration objects directly on the marble table top, or use felt pads under the objects. Also avoid placing decoration objects on the same place for a longer period of time, since this can cause discoloration of the marble.
- Avoid placing hard or sharp objects directly on the marble table top or to pull objects across the table top surface.
- Avoid placing hot objects directly on the marble table top, since the heat can cause marks and stains, and there is a risk that the surface treatment can be damaged.
- For daily care use a damp cloth without detergents or washing liquids, since this can cause discoloration or damage to the surface. A mixture of water and pH neutral soap can also be used. Always wipe off with a dry cloth to remove excess moisture from the surface. Please note that the use of water and soap can cause stripes, and that too much soap can create a film that makes the surface dull and difficult to maintain.
- Your new dk3 marble table is delivered with a basic surface treatment, a so-called stone-sealer. We recommend to give the table a stone-sealer treatment approximately once every second year. Please note that the use of a stone-sealer is no guarantee that the marble top will not absorb various liquids. In case of damages to the marble top we recommend to contact a marble expert.
